APC Now Taking Applications for 2009 MIL Program

APC announces that the second cohort of the Master's in Intercultural Leadership will begin the program in June, 2009. This exciting new course of study is designed to prepare future leaders in the Asia-Pacific region for the environmental, demographic, economic, and diplomatic challenges of the 21st century. Courses train students in skills such as conducting quantitative and qualitative research, as well as in developing the analytical thinking skills necessary to identify the roots of a problem and use past examples and clear thinking in searching for solutions. The courses offered to the 2009 cohort in the MIL program will cover a wide range of topics. These include Leadership Theory and Practice; Politics of Asia and the Pacific; Leadership and Cultural Knowledge; Global Theory and Events; Leadership for Peace and Harmony; Economics of Asia and the Pacific; Human Rights and Governance; Education and Leadership; Organizational Leadership and Management; and Quantitative and Qualitative Research Methods.

Faculty for these courses include Dr. Jeffrey Ady (Professor and former Chair, UHM Department of Communication); Dr. Bruce E. Barnes (Professor of Conflict Resolution, UHM Matsunaga Institute for Peace); Dr. Robin Brandt (Director, Pacific Basin Rehabilitation Research and Training Center); Dr. George Kent (Professor of Political Science, UHM); Dr. Sumner La Croix (Adjunct Senior Fellow, East-West Center; Professor, UHM Department of Economics); Dr. Deane Neubauer (Senior Advisor,

East-West Center; Emeritus Professor and former UH Chancellor, UHM Department of Political Science); and Dr. Jungmin Seo (Assistant Professor, UHM Department of Political Science).

First Cohort Making Good Progress

APC's first cohort in the Master's for Intercultural Leadership are now in their third semester of studies. Currently, they are enrolled in two online courses, Leadership for Peace and Harmony (APC 504) and Economics of Asia and the Pacific (APC 550). Their instructors report they are doing well, and the discussions and papers often prove thought-provoking. These remarkable students are pursuing their studies while simultaneously managing demanding full-time professional jobs to support themselves and their families. APC designed the online format specifically so that anyone, anywhere in the world would be able to benefit from this program of study, regardless of their geographical location.
